

RESTORING WETLANDS

- Invested over \$31.7
 million in projects that
 further the goal of
 restoring 100,000
 acres of tidal wetlands
- Complete ecosystems, in the baylands or watersheds





RESTORING WATER QUALITY

Invested over \$31 million to improve water quality in the Bay and its watersheds.







GREENING DEVELOPMENT

Invested ~\$8.5 million to improve Bay Area stormwater quality.





NEW-BIL GOALS

Expand water quality restoration efforts and build regional resilience to climate change stressors in underserved communities.



Outputs & Outcomes

- Outputs = activities and/or deliverables
- Outcomes = environmental results, effects, or consequences
 - Outcomes must be quantified, and provide timeframe for expected results
 - Outcomes may be environmental, behavioral, healthrelated, or programmatic in nature, but must be quantitative.
- A description of how the project will track progress towards achieving outputs and outcomes is expected.







What is the selection process?

Applications (proposals) due September 20, 2022

EPA conducts threshold eligibility review

EPA Review Committee will score and rank proposals

EPA notifies applicants of funding status mid-November 2022

Applicants submit full funding package to EPA December 5, 2022

Grant awards expected December 2022
