RE: Withdrawal of Elements of California's Request for Authorization, Pursuant to Clean Air Act Section 209(e)(2), for the Commercial Harbor Craft (CHC) Regulation, Docket ID EPA-HQ-OAR-2023-0153

Dear Acting Administrator Nishida:

The California Air Resources Board (CARB) appreciates the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency's (EPA) recent partial authorization of its Commercial Harbor Craft (CHC) regulation.¹

In its action, U.S. EPA did not take final action on two elements of the CHC regulation for in-use engines and vessels: the zero-emission and advanced technologies (ZEAT) standards for in-use short-run ferries and the emissions "standards for in-use engines and vessels (excluding commercial fishing vessels) that would apply after the expiration of the feasibility extensions". CARB accordingly withdraws its request for authorization of these aforementioned elements of the CHC regulation: the zero-emission and advanced technologies (ZEAT) standards for in-use short-run ferries and the emissions standards for in-use engines and vessels (excluding commercial fishing vessels) that would apply after the expiration of the feasibility extensions.
