Vickery Environmental, Inc.

Draft reissuance of exemption from Land Disposal Restrictions of the Hazardous and Solid Waste Amendments of 1984 for the injection of hazardous waste

The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (“EPA”), Region 5, located at 77 West Jackson Blvd. Chicago IL 60604, is providing notice of its intent to reissue, and an opportunity to comment on, a draft exemption from the Land Disposal Restrictions of the Hazardous and Solid Waste Amendments (HSWA) of 1984 to the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act (RCRA) to Vickery Environmental, Inc. (“VEI”), 3956 State Route 412, Vickery, Ohio, for the injection of hazardous waste into five wells, under Section 1422(c) of the Safe Drinking Water Act (SDWA), 42 U.S.C. §300h-1(c); Sections 3004 (d)-(m) of RCRA, 42 U.S.C. §§ 6924 (d)-(m); 40 C.F.R. §§ 146.63-146.64 and Part 148, subpart C.

PUBLIC NOTICE: As provided in the attached fact sheet, VEI injects into four Class I hazardous wells and plans to inject into one additional Class I hazardous well liquid hazardous waste from a variety of sources under a reissued land ban exemption. EPA is providing notice and opportunity to comment on the modified conditions of the draft land ban exemption. The comment period will close at 11:59 pm on February 18, 2025.

OPPORTUNITY FOR COMMENT:

Modified conditions of the draft Land Ban Exemption

Consistent with the attached fact sheet for the draft land ban exemption, EPA is providing public notice of, and an opportunity to comment on, the modified conditions of the drafted land ban exemption pursuant to 40 C.F.R. §§ 124.10,124.12. The modified conditions of the drafted land ban exemption concern the Well No. 8 located in northeastern Sandusky County, Ohio. EPA reissued the land ban exemption in 2015 authorizing the continuation of the existing land ban exemption. During the public comment period, any interested person may submit written comments on the modified conditions of the draft land ban exemption. Only the modified conditions proposed for the exemption reissuance are open for comment.
